(Organising Authority (OA))

NOTICE OF RACE 2024-25

South of Perth Yacht Club (**SoPYC**) has the pleasure of inviting you to participate in its 79th Sailing Season from October 2024 to September 2025.

1. RULES

- 1.1 These events are governed by the rules as defined in:
 - a) The Racing Rules of Sailing (**RRS**).
 - b) The Prescriptions of Australian Sailing (**AS**) including the Special Regulations.
 - c) The Class Rules where applicable.
 - d) The SoPYC Performance Handicap Rules (**PHS**) where applicable.
 - e) The Offshore Racing Congress Rating (Club) (**ORCC**) system will apply where applicable. The "Triple Number, Coastal" rating will be used.
 - f) Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 1.2 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty for all Keelboat, Off the Beach (**OTB**) and DF95 races.
- 1.3 Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSI's), separate Notice of Races (**NoR's**) and Sailing Instructions (**SIs**) may be issued for individual events.
- 1.4 **AS Race Equipment Audit Categories**

All boats/boards (**boats**) shall comply with the following AS Race Equipment Audit Category:

 - a) Category 7 – For Keelboats competing on Swan River during daylight hours.
 - b) Category 6 – For Keelboats competing in inshore races i.e. The Billy Run.
 - c) Special Regulations Part 2 - Off the Beach Boats.

2. RED BOOK, SAILING INSTRUCTIONS & RACE DOCUMENTS

The Red Book contains this NoR, the SI's and Race Documents and will be available from the On Water Group Office (**OWG**) and online.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official notice board is located in the foyer of the main clubhouse, OTB notices will be duplicated on the OTB notice board located on the wall of the OTB Clubhouse. The online notice board is located on the SoPYC web site.
- 3.2 All Keelboats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on VHF 16, 69 & 77. **[DP]**
- 3.3 On the water, the Race Committee (**RC**) will monitor these channels and communicate with competitors on **VHF 69**.
- 3.4 While racing, from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. **[DP]**
- 3.3 The Race Officer may be contacted **in an emergency on 0412 704 945**.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The events are open to all boats of the following divisions and classes:
 - a) **SATURDAY KEELBOAT SERIES**

Division 1, Division 2, Division 3, S80, SS27, SS22, H28 & Red Witch.

On Club Championship race days: Division 1 boats eligible for ORCC will compete as a sub-division and Division 2 Cole32's will compete as a sub-division.

- b) **MIDWEEK KEELBOAT SERIES**
Division 1, Division 2, Division 3 and H28 Class.
- c) **TWILIGHT KEELBOAT SERIES**
Division 1, Division 2 and Division 3.
- d) **FROSTBITE KEELBOAT SERIES**
Division 1, Division 2 and Division 3.
- e) **OFF THE BEACH BOATS (OTB) SUMMER SERIES & OTB WINTER SERIES**
Optimist, O’pen Skiff, ILCA 7, 6, & 4, Windsurfer LT, Quest, Flying Fifteen and Viper 640.
- d) **DF95 SERIES - DF95s**

4.2 **The following rating systems apply:**

- 4.4 If, by the first scheduled race of a series, there are less than 5 Keelboats (KB) or 4 OTB boats entered in a fleet, then the OA may abandon the series or amalgamate the boats into a another or a ‘mixed fleet’.
- 4.5 Eligible boats may enter by completing and submitting the online entry form before their first race of the respective series.
- 4.6 To be considered an entry in an event, a boat shall complete the following registration requirements:
 - a) Be listed on the SoPYC Vessel Register.
 - b) Submit a completed AS Special Regulations Equipment Audit Form.
 - c) Hold a valid third-party liability insurance policy with a minimum cover of \$10million per incident or the equivalent. **It is strongly recommended that the insurance includes a “racing” extension.**
 - d) A boat shall sail in the fleet to which it is assigned by the OA.

4.7 **Helmsperson**

The Helmsperson shall be a current financial member of SoPYC at least equivalent to the following categories:

4.7.1 **Keelboats (KB):**

- a) Ordinary, Life, 60 Year or Centreboard Member.
- b) A substitute Helmsperson under NoR11.1(b) shall be a financial member of SoPYC from any membership category.
- c) Helmspersons of approved visiting boats shall hold the equivalent membership noted in NoR4.7.1(a) at a club affiliated with AS.
- d) In special circumstances, with a request in writing, the OA may approve a Junior SoPYC Member who meets the competency criteria, to be the Helmsperson of a KB.
- e) A KB may nominate more than one Helmsperson, provided that each is eligible and, for handicap purposes, the arrangement for sharing the boat entry is stated. Note: Only one Helmsperson may helm during the race.
- f) For the Spacesailer 22 ‘Crew Helmsperson’ Race, the nominated helm must also have participated in 50% of said boats races for the Saturday Series.

4.7.2 Off the Beach Boats (OTB):

- a) Ordinary, Life, 60 Year, Centreboard or Junior Member.
- b) Helmspersons of approved visiting boats shall hold the equivalent membership noted in NoR 4.7.2(a) at a club affiliated with AS.
- c) For OTB Club Championship series, there shall be no substitutions.

4.7.3 DF95s:

- a) Any SoPYC membership category.
- b) Helmspersons of approved visiting boats shall hold the equivalent membership at a club affiliated with RSAWA.
- c) For DF95 Club Championship series, there shall be no substitutions.

5 FEES - Unless specified in a separate NoR, there are no fees applicable.

6 LIMITATIONS

- 6.1 Visiting boats shall be registered at a club affiliated with AS.
- 6.2 Visiting boats shall be eligible to compete in any event except those designated in the Schedule of Events as "Club Championship".
- 6.3 For scoring purposes, a visiting boat is only eligible to be included in a series that is designated as an invitation series.
- 6.4 Crew not complying with the AS Prescription - RRS46, shall obtain a Day Membership Sail Pass. The Club's Day Pass guidelines are included in the Red Book and online.

7 SCHEDULE

Racing is as per the "Schedule of Events" published in the Red Book and online.

8 THE HULL, EQUIPMENT & MEASUREMENT

- 8.1 If required, each boat shall produce or verify the existence of a **valid measurement or rating certificate**.
- 8.2 **Sails – KB** - For the Midweek and Twilight Series, boats may only carry normal working sails tacked in the normal position for working to windward. Boats shall not use asymmetrical spinnakers or the like. A sail may be poled out.
- 8.3 **Change of Hull (OTB & DF95)**
 - a) Change of hull and the carry-over of results will be permitted for classes where SoPYC club rental/try-before-you-buy arrangements have been entered in the first part of the series.
 - b) Other OTB classes may seek permission, in writing, for the same dispensation which will be considered by the OA on a case-by-case basis.
 - c) DF95s may replace hulls due to damage.

9 RACING AREAS AND COURSES

- 9.1 Races will be conducted on Melville Water, Canning River or as shown in separate SI's & SSI's.
- 9.2 Course sheets will be available at the OWG, published in the Red Book and online.
- 9.3 OTB course sheets will also be available from the Centreboard Clubhouse.

10 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 10.1 RRS44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 10.2 Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 10.3 **[DP]** Discretionary Penalty – the penalty for a breach of this rule may, at the discretion of the Protest Committee, be less than disqualification.
- 10.4 **[NP]** Breaches of the SI's marked [NP] will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS60.1(a).

- 10.5 **[SCP] Scoring Penalty** – for some specific breaches of the rules, the RC may apply an SCP without a hearing. The RC may still protest a boat when they consider the SCP inappropriate. The SCP is 2 points. This changes RRS63.1 & A5.

11 SCORING

11.1 For scoring purposes:

- a) 'Boat' means the combination of a hull to which a sail number is assigned and the nominated helmsperson (NoR4.7).
- b) The helmsperson of a KB may apply, in writing, for a SoPYC member who regularly crews on that KB to be the substitute helmsperson. This applies to all the series and the handicap may be amended. After three substitutions, NoR11.1(a) applies.
- c) The helmsperson of an OTB boat may apply, in writing, for a SoPYC member to be substituted for three consistency race days per season. The handicap may be amended. After three consistency race day substitutions NoR11.1(a) applies.
- d) A boat shall be entered in a series for which it is eligible when it first comes to the starting area of a race of that series.

11.2 Scoring will be in accordance with the RRS Appendix A (including A5.3) amended as follows:

11.2.1 Saturday, Twilight, Frostbite and OTB Consistency Series

- a) All divisions & classes scored on Club Performance Handicap.
- b) The number of races to constitute a series shall be 40% of all scheduled races.
- c) A boat's series score shall exclude **one worst score per 6 races** completed and scored except for Division 1 and their ORCC sub fleet which shall exclude **one worst score per 4 races** completed and scored.

11.2.2 Midweek Consistency Series

- a) All divisions & classes scored on Club Performance Handicap.
- b) The number of races to constitute a series shall be 40% of all scheduled races.
- c) A boat's series score shall exclude **one worst score per 5 races** completed and scored except for Division 1 and their ORCC sub fleet which shall exclude **one worst score per 4 races** completed and scored.

11.2.3 Club Championship Series

- a) One Design Classes – Over the line results.
- b) Division 1 – ORCC rating handicaps.
- c) Division 3 – Club Performance handicaps (Doug Rickman Series)

11.3 The Club Championship number of races required to be completed to constitute a series, and the number of discards shall be in accordance with the table below:

12 SUPPORT & COACH BOATS [DP]

- 12.1 Except when rendering assistance to a boat in distress, all support and coach boats shall remain **at least 50 metres outside** areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished or the RC signals a postponement, general recall, or abandonment.
- 12.2 All support and coach boats shall have a VHF radio and maintain a listening watch on **VHF 69** or any other channel specified by the Race Officer.
- 12.3 All support and coach boats shall render assistance as and when directed by the Race Officer.
- 12.4 All support boats shall have a minimum of **two able bodied persons** aboard.

- 12.5 All occupants of support and coach boats, less than 6m LOA, shall wear an approved **PFD** whilst afloat.
- 12.6 Skippers of support and coach boats, shall wear the **engine kill switch cord**.

13 SAFETY KEELBOATS [DP]

- 13.1 While racing, no anchor shall be carried on deck forward of the stem or protruding outward from the hull.
- 13.2 Operable marine VHF radios shall be carried, which may be permanently installed or waterproof handheld and shall be **turned on** whilst racing.
- 13.3 In addition to the Helmsperson, there shall be at least one crew member who shall be competent to handle the boat in an emergency.
- 13.4 All sailors competing **double handed shall wear a PFD** Type 1, Level 100 or higher which conforms to AS 4758 or ISO 12402 or AS 1512.

14 RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: ‘The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.’ By participating in these events each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds, rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.** The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

15 INSURANCE

Each participating boat/board (excluding DF95s) shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUD 10 million per incident or equivalent. **It is strongly recommended that such insurance include a racing extension.**

16 PRIZES

16.1 Pennants will be awarded in each race and series for each fleet:

a) Handicap results:



b) Club Championship results:



c) Visiting crew may be nominated by their Skipper to receive a Visitors Pennant.



Visitors Pennant

d) Visiting boats will be eligible for pennants in the days races but shall not be eligible for any series prizes or trophies.

- 16.2 Trophies & Prizes will be awarded for Club Championship and Consistency series with other awards as published in the Red Book.
- 16.3 Season perpetual trophies will be awarded at the annual presentations. Perpetual trophies shall remain at the clubhouse.

- 16.4 if there is a trophy to be awarded for a single race on a multiple race day, the trophy shall be awarded for the result in the first race, unless otherwise stated.
- 16.5 A minimum of two starters in a fleet are required to constitute a race.
- 16.6 If the average number of boats in a division or class competing in each series is less than 4, series trophies will only be awarded to first place.

17 PRESENTATIONS

Daily Result presentations will be at a time and location as notified.

18 MEDIA

By participating in these events, competitors grant to the Organising Authority, Australian Sailing and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, digital media, motion pictures and live, taped, or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.

From 1st January 2022, all persons on board a boat while racing shall be members of a Club affiliated to Australian Sailing and have an Australian Sailing number, or hold a valid **SailPass**, or if an international competitor, be a member of club affiliated to a World Sailing recognised Member National Authority.

SAILPASS MEMBERSHIP

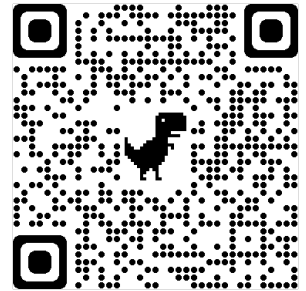
Currently in affect, non-member competitors shall obtain a Day Membership SailPass available by registering through our website.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in:
- The Racing Rules of Sailing (**RRS**).
 - The Prescriptions of Australian Sailing (**AS**) including the Special Regulations.
 - The Class Rules where applicable.
 - The SoPYC Performance Handicapping Rules (**PHS**) where applicable.
 - The ORC Club Measurement System (**ORCC**) where applicable.
 - Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 1.2 RRS44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

-  Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted not less than 2 hours before the scheduled warning signal on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.


3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Notices to Competitors (**NTC**) will be posted on the official notice board located in the foyer of the main clubhouse and online.
- 3.2 The race office is the On Water Group (**OWG**).
- 3.3 On the water, the Race Committee (**RC**) will monitor VHF 16, 77 & communicate with competitors on **VHF 69**.
- 3.4 The call sign for South of Perth Yacht Club is '**South of Perth Race Control**'.
- 3.5 While racing, from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. **[DP]**

4. CODE OF CONDUCT **[DP]**

Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials and adhere to the AS Code of Conduct.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the signal mast on the main clubhouse lawn.
- 5.2 Signals made at the Start Box are deemed to be made afloat.
- 5.3 When **Flag AP** is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in Race Signals AP. 

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1 The schedule of races, which includes the times of the first warning signals are published in the Red Book and online.
- 6.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least one minute before a warning signal is made.

7. DIVISION/CLASS FLAGS

7.2 Boats shall display their fleet flag from the backstay or mainsail leech when racing.

7.3 The flag shall be removed when no longer racing.

8. RACING AREA

Races will be conducted on Melville Water and Canning River.

9. COURSES

9.1 The Courses for each fleet are available from the OWG and online.

9.2 The Course to be sailed will be designated by an international numeral pennant corresponding to the course number displayed below the fleet flag.

10. MARKS

10.1 Marks for the Courses will be fixed marks as shown on the 'Saturday Series 2024/25 Courses' sheets.

10.2 **Missing Mark** - If a mark is missing and **Flag 'M'** is not in position, boats shall round the mark as if it were in its usual position. This changes RRS34. 

10.3 **Day Buoy** 

Flag 'Q' displayed at the warning signal indicates a yellow Day Buoy has been laid to windward of the starting line.

a) **Flag 'Q'** with a **red Port** flag means 'After starting, boats shall round the yellow Day Buoy and then the **red** Clearance Buoy, leaving both to **port**, before continuing to the first mark of the course.'

b) **Flag 'Q'** with a **green Starboard** flag means 'After starting, boats shall round the yellow Day Buoy and then the **green** Clearance Buoy, leaving both to **starboard**, before continuing to the first mark of the course.'

11. OBSTRUCTIONS

The following areas, lines and navigation posts are designated as obstructions:

a) The area encompassing the northern point of the western hardstand, Heathcote Channel and Heathcote Spit (22).

b) An imaginary line between Bricklanding buoys (33A) and (33B).

c) An imaginary line between Smith buoy (35A) and Lucky Bay buoy (35B).

d) All navigation posts carrying top marks (except Outer Dolphin (17), Foam Spit (18) and Deepwater Spit (37)) shall not rank as marks but shall rank as obstructions for the purpose of RRS19.


e) While racing, all navigation posts carrying top marks, except Outer Dolphin (17), Foam Spit (18) and Deepwater Spit (37), shall be passed on their correct navigational side.

12. THE START


- 12.1 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races. **[DP]**.
- 12.2 Boats that are near the starting line in the last minute of another fleets start may receive an **[SCP]** without a hearing.
- 12.3 A boat that does not start within five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (**DNS**) without a hearing. This changes RRSA5.
- 12.4 **General Recall** - When a **General Recall** is signalled, the warning signal for a new start for the first recalled fleet will be made at the starting signal of the last fleet in the original sequence. New starts for other recalled fleets will follow in the order thereafter. A General Recall signal will be displayed for one minute. This changes RRS29.2 and race signal, 'First Substitute'.



12.5 Mid-River Starts:

- The Mid-River Start Line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee (**RC**) boat at the starboard end and a black and white chequered inflatable buoy at the port end.
- A buoy may be attached to the stern of the **RC** boat. Boats shall not pass between this buoy and the **RC** boat at any time.
- The RC may relocate a mid-river start to the Start Box at any time. Flag 'R'  displayed ashore or afloat with 3 sound signals, means 'all races not yet started shall start in accordance with SI_12.6.'

12.6 Box Starts:

- The **Box Start line** will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Box and the outermost of the two yellow pyramid buoys. The inner yellow buoy will mark the extent but not necessarily the position of the line and shall be left on the same hand as the Start Box.
- When a race is scheduled or signalled to start at the Box, boats shall start in a **northerly direction** leaving Sampson Spit (19) to Port, before continuing on their signalled course.
- If **Flag 'D'** is displayed no later than the 'on station signal', boats shall start in a **southerly direction** and leave additional marks, Martin Buoy (69), Weaver Buoy (68),  Outer Start Line Buoy and Sampson Spit (19) all to Port, before continuing on their signalled course.

12.7 Pursuit Starts:

- Start times shall be taken from the visual signals; the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded. This changes RRS26.
- Boats shall start in accordance with the following pursuit race signals:

Signal	Flag and Sound	Minutes before starting signal
Warning	Division/Class Flag displayed, '00' displayed - 1 sound	5
4 minutes to Start	P Flag displayed '00' displayed - 1 sound	4
1 minute to Start	P Flag removed '00' displayed - 1 long sound	1
First Start	Timer begins count up '00' displayed - 1 sound	0

- Pursuit race start times will be displayed in sequence from '00' from the first start signal and increasing in one-minute intervals.
- Boats shall start when their start time is displayed.

- e) A boat which starts before its allocated start time will be penalised by adding two minutes to its finish time plus one minute for each full or part minute early.
- f) No recall signals will be made. This changes RRS29.
- g) Once individual boat start times are published, they may be updated up to 2 hours prior to the 1st warning signal and the affected boats notified by SMS.
- h) Courses shall be the fleets Course 4 unless detailed in a separate SSI.
- i) Flag D shall be disregarded for Pursuit races.

13. SHORTENING THE COURSE

13.1 **Before the start** – The RC may shorten a course before the starting signal by flying **Flag 'S'** over the relevant fleet flag no later than the warning signal. The marks prefixed * on the Course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS32.

13.2 **After the start:**

- a) When a fleets course includes rounding the outer start line buoy, the RC may shorten the course for that fleet by flying **Flag 'S'** over the fleets flag. The marks prefixed * on the Course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS 32.
- b) The RC may shorten the course in accordance with RRS32.2 - A RC vessel will fly **Flag 'S'**, the relevant fleets flag(s) and the **Blue Finish Line Flag**.

14. THE FINISH

The Finish Line will be between a staff displaying the blue finish line flag from the Box and the outermost of the two yellow pyramid buoys. The inner yellow buoy will mark the extent but not necessarily the position of the line.

15. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 15.1 RRS44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 15.2 Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 15.3 **[DP]** Discretionary Penalty – the penalty for a breach of this rule may, at the discretion of the Protest Committee, be less than disqualification.
- 15.4 **[NP]** Breaches of the SI's marked [NP] will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS60.1 (a).
- 15.5 **[SCP]** Scoring Penalty – for some specific breaches of the rules, the RC may apply an SCP without a hearing. The RC may still protest a boat when they consider the SCP inappropriate. The SCP is 2 points. This changes RRS63.1 & A5.

16. TIME LIMIT

- 16.1 The Race Time Limit is 1730.
- 16.2 If no boat has finished within the time limit, the race will be abandoned.

17. PROTEST HEARING REQUESTS

- 17.1 The protest time limit is one hour after the last boat finishes.
- 17.2 Hearing request forms are available from OWG and online.

18. SCORING – refer NoR

19. SAFETY REGULATIONS [DP]

- 19.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the RC at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 19.2 While racing, no anchor shall be carried on the deck forward of the stem or protruding outward of the hull.
- 19.3 Operable marine VHF radios shall be carried, which may be permanently installed or be waterproof handheld and shall be turned on whilst racing.
- 19.4 In addition to the Helmsperson, there shall be at least one crew member who shall be competent to handle the boat in an emergency.

19.5 All sailors competing **double-handed shall wear a PFD** Type 1, Level 100 or higher which conforms to AS 4758 or ISO 12402 or AS 1512.

20 SIGN ON [SCP][NP]

20.1 All boats shall sign on with the TopYacht links supplied at registration and are available on the club website.

20.2 It is the Skipper's responsibility to record all persons on board their boat.

20.3 Boats that fail to Sign On shall receive a **[SCP]** without a hearing.

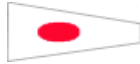

MIDWEEK SERIES SAILING INSTRUCTIONS



SOUTH of PERTH YACHT CLUB (Organising Authority (OA)) **MIDWEEK SERIES 2024/2025** **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in:
 - a) The Racing Rules of Sailing (**RRS**).
 - b) The Prescriptions of Australian Sailing (**AS**) including the Special Regulations.
 - c) The SoPYC Performance Handicap Rules (**PHS**) where applicable.
 - d) The ORC Club Measurement System (**ORCC**) where applicable.
 - e) Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 1.2 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 1.3 **Sails** - Boats may only carry normal working sails tacked in the normal position for working to windward. Boats shall not use asymmetrical spinnakers or the like. A sail may be poled out.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS



Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted not less than 2 hours before the scheduled warning signal on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.


3. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notice to competitors (**NTC**) will be posted on the official notice board located in the foyer of the main clubhouse and online.
- 3.2 The race office is the On Water Group (**OWG**).
- 3.3 On the water, the Race Committee (**RC**) will monitor VHF 16, 77 and communicate with competitors on **VHF 69**.
- 3.4 The call sign for South of Perth Yacht Club is '**South of Perth Race Control**'.
- 3.5 While racing, from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. **[DP]**

4. CODE OF CONDUCT [DP]

Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials and adhere to the AS Code of Conduct.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the signal mast on the main clubhouse lawn.
- 5.2 Signals made at the Start Box are deemed to be made afloat.
- 5.3 When **Flag AP** is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in Race Signals AP. 

6. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 The schedule of races which includes the time of the first warning signal are published in the Red Book and online.

6.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least one minute before a warning signal is made.

7. DIVISION/CLASS FLAGS

7.1 The Division/Class flags are:

Division 1	Naval Numeral 1		Division 2	Naval Numeral 2	
Division 3	Naval Numeral 3		H28 Class	Naval Numeral 7	

7.2 The fleet flag shall be displayed from the backstay or mainsail leech when racing.

7.3 The flag shall be removed when no longer racing.

8. RACING AREA

Races will be conducted on Melville Water and Canning River.

9. COURSES

9.1 The Courses for each fleet are available from OWG and online.

9.2 The course to be sailed will be designated by an international numeral pennant corresponding to the course number displayed below the fleet flag.

9.3 **Pursuit Races only** - Boats shall start in a northerly direction sailing their fleets course 4. The displaying of Flag 'D' shall be disregarded.

10. MARKS

10.1 Marks for the Courses will be fixed marks as shown on the 'Midweek Series 2024/25 Courses' sheets.

10.2 **Missing Mark** - If a mark is missing and **Flag 'M'** is not in position, boats shall round the mark as if it were in it's usual position. This changes RRS34. 

11. OBSTRUCTIONS


The following areas and lines are designated as obstructions:


- The area encompassing the northern point of the western hardstand, Heathcote Channel and Heathcote Spit (22).
- An imaginary line between Bricklanding buoys (33A) and (33B).
- An imaginary line between Smith buoy (35A) and Lucky Bay buoy (35B).
- All navigation posts carrying top marks (except Outer Dolphin (17), Foam Spit (18) and Deepwater Spit (37)) shall not rank as marks but shall rank as obstructions for the purpose of RRS19.
- While racing, all navigation posts carrying top marks, except Outer Dolphin (17), Foam Spit (18) and Deepwater Spit (37), shall be passed on their correct navigational side.

12. THE START

12.1 The Start line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Box and the outermost of the two yellow pyramid buoys. The inner yellow buoy will mark the extent but not necessarily the position of the line and shall be left on the same hand as the Box.

12.2 Boats shall start in a **northerly direction** to the first mark of the course.

12.3 If **Flag 'D'** is displayed no later than the 'on station signal', boats shall start in a **southerly direction** and leave additional marks, Martin Buoy (69), Weaver Buoy (68) and the  Outer Start Line Buoy all to **Port**, before continuing to the first mark of the course.

- 12.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence of other races. **[DP]**
- 12.5 Boats that are **near the starting line in the last minute of another fleets start** may receive an **[SCP]** without a hearing.
- 12.6 A boat that does not start within five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (**DNS**) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.
- 12.7 **General Recall** - When a General Recall is signalled, the warning signal for a new start for the first recalled fleet will be made at the starting signal of the last fleet in the original sequence. New starts for other recalled fleets will follow in the order thereafter. A General Recall signal will be displayed for one minute. This changes RRS 29.2 and race signal, 'First Substitute'. 
- 12.8 **Pursuit Starts:**
- a) Boats shall start in accordance with the following pursuit race signals:

Signal	Flag and Sound	Minutes before starting signal
Warning	Division/Class Flag displayed, '00' displayed - 1 sound	5
4 minutes to Start	P Flag displayed '00' displayed - 1 sound	4
1 minute to Start	P Flag removed '00' displayed - 1 long sound	1
First Start	Timer begins count up '00' displayed - 1 sound	0

- b) Start times shall be taken from the visual signals; the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded. This changes RRS 26.
- c) Pursuit race start times will be displayed in sequence from '00' from the first start signal and increasing in one-minute intervals.
- d) Boats shall start when their start time is displayed.
- e) A boat which starts before its allocated start time will be penalised by adding two minutes to its finish time plus one minute for each full or part minute early.
- f) No recall signals will be made. This changes RRS 29.
- g) Once individual boat start times are published, they may be updated up to 2 hours prior to the 1st warning signal and the affected boats notified by SMS.
- h) Courses shall be the fleets Course 4 unless detailed in a separate SSI.

13. SHORTENING THE COURSE

- 13.1 **Before the start** - The RC may shorten a course before the starting signal by flying **Flag 'S'** over the relevant fleets flag no later than the warning signal. The marks prefixed * on the Course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS 32.
- 13.2 **After the start**
- (a) The RC may shorten a course after the starting signal by flying Flag 'S' over the relevant fleets flag(s). The marks prefixed * on the Course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS 32.
- (b) The RC may shorten the course in accordance with RRS 32.2 - A RC vessel will fly **Flag S**, the relevant fleet flag and the **Blue Finish Line Flag**.

14. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 14.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 14.2 Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.

- 14.3 **[DP]** Discretionary Penalty – the penalty for a breach of this rule may at the discretion of the Protest Committee, be less than disqualification.
- 14.4 **[NP]** Breaches of the SI's marked [NP] will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS60.1(a).
- 14.5 **[SCP]** Scoring Penalty – for some specific breaches of the rules, the RC may apply an SCP without a hearing. The RC may still protest a boat when they consider the SCP inappropriate. The SCP is 2 points. This changes RRS63.1 & A5.

15. TIME LIMIT

- 15.1 The Race Time Limit is 1715.
- 15.2 If no boat has finished within the time limit, the race will be abandoned.

16. PROTEST HEARING REQUESTS

- 16.1 The protest time limit is one hour after the last boat finishes.
- 16.2 Hearing request forms are available from OWG and online.

17. SCORING – refer NoR

18. SAFETY REGULATIONS [DP]

- 18.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the RC at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 18.2 While racing, no anchor shall be carried on the deck forward of the stem or protruding outward of the hull.
- 18.3 Operable marine VHF radios shall be carried, which may be permanently installed or be waterproof handheld and **shall be turned on** whilst racing.
- 18.4 In addition to the Helmsperson, there shall be **at least one crew member who shall be competent to handle the boat in an emergency**.
- 18.5 All sailors competing **double-handed shall wear a PFD** Type 1, Level 100 or higher which conforms to AS 4758 or ISO 12402 or AS 1512.

19. SIGN ON [SCP][NP]

- 19.1 All boats shall sign on with the TopYacht links supplied at registration and are available on the club website.
- 19.2 It is the Skipper's responsibility to record all persons on board their boat.
- 19.3 Boats that fail to "Sign On" shall receive a **[SCP]** without a hearing.

TWILIGHT SERIES SAILING INSTRUCTIONS



SOUTH of PERTH YACHT CLUB (Organising Authority (OA)) TWILIGHT SERIES 2024/2025 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in:
 - a) The Racing Rules of Sailing (**RRS**).
 - b) The Prescriptions of Australian Sailing (**AS**) including the Special Regulations.
 - c) The SoPYC Performance Handicap Rules (**PHS**) where applicable.
 - d) Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 1.2 RRS44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 1.3 **Sails** - Boats may only carry normal working sails tacked in the normal position for working to windward. Boats shall not use asymmetrical spinnakers or the like. A sail may be poled out.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS



Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted not less than 2 hours before the scheduled warning signal on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.


3. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notice to competitors (**NTC**) will be posted on the official notice board located in the foyer of the main clubhouse and online.
- 3.2 The race office is the On Water Group (**OWG**).
- 3.3 On the water, the Race Committee (**RC**) will monitor VHF 16, 77 and communicate with competitors on **VHF 69**.
- 3.4 The call sign for South of Perth Yacht Club is '**South of Perth Race Control**'.
- 3.5 While racing, from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. **[DP]**

4. CODE OF CONDUCT **[DP]**

Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials and adhere to the AS Code of Conduct.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the signal mast on the main clubhouse lawn.
- 5.2 Signals made at the Start Box are deemed to be made afloat.
- 5.3 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in Race Signals AP. 

6. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 The schedule of races, which includes the time of the first warning signal, is published in the Red Book and online.

6.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least one minute before a warning signal is made.

7. DIVISION FLAGS

7.2 The fleet flag shall be displayed from the backstay or mainsail leech when racing.

9. COURSES

9.1 The Courses for each fleet are available from the OWG and online.

9.2 The course to be sailed will be designated by an international numeral pennant corresponding to the course number displayed below the fleet flag.

10. MARKS

10.1 Marks for the Courses will be fixed marks as shown on the 'Twilight Series 2024/25 Courses' sheets.

10.2 **Missing Mark** - If a mark is missing and **Flag 'M'** is not in position, boats shall round the mark as if it were in it's usual position. This changes RRS34. 

11. OBSTRUCTIONS

The following areas and lines are designated as obstructions:

- a) The area encompassing the northern point of the western hardstand, Heathcote Channel and Heathcote Spit (22).
- b) All navigation posts carrying top marks (except Outer Dolphin (17), Foam Spit (18) and Deepwater Spit (37)) shall not rank as marks but shall rank as obstructions for the purpose of RRS19.
- c) While racing, all navigation posts carrying top marks, except Outer Dolphin (17), Foam Spit (18) and Deepwater Spit (37), shall be passed on their correct navigational side.

12. THE START

12.1 The Start line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Box and the outermost of the two yellow pyramid buoys. The inner yellow buoy will mark the extent but not necessarily the position of the line and shall be left on the same hand as the Box.

12.2 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races. **[DP]**

12.3 Boats that are **near the starting line in the last minute of another fleets start** may receive an **[SCP]** without a hearing.

12.4 A boat that does not start within five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (**DNS**) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.

12.5 **General Recall** - There will be no General Recalls. This changes RRS29.2.

13. SHORTENING THE COURSE



- 13.1 **Before the start** – The RC may shorten a course before the starting signal by flying **Flag ‘S’** over the relevant fleets flag no later than the warning signal. The marks prefixed * on the course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS32.
- 13.2 **After the start** - The RC may shorten a course after the starting signal by flying **Flag ‘S’** over the relevant fleets flag. The marks prefixed * on the course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS32.

14. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 14.1 RRS44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 14.2 Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 14.3 **[DP]** Discretionary Penalty – the penalty for a breach of this rule may at the discretion of the Protest Committee, be less than disqualification.
- 14.4 **[NP]** Breaches of the SI's marked [NP] will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS60.1(a).
- 14.5 **[SCP]** Scoring Penalty – for some specific breaches of the rules, the RC may apply a SCP without a hearing. The RC may still protest a boat when they consider the SCP inappropriate. The SCP is 2 points. This changes RRS63.1 and A5.

15. TIME LIMIT

- 15.1 The Race Time Limit for the Twilight Series is **1945**.
- 15.2 If no boat has finished within the time limit, the race will be abandoned.

16. PROTEST HEARING REQUESTS

- 16.1 The protest time limit is one hour after the last boat finishes.
- 16.2 Hearing request forms are available from OWG and online.

17. SCORING – refer NoR

18. SAFETY REGULATIONS [DP]

- 18.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the RC at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 18.2 While racing, no anchor shall be carried on the deck forward of the stem or protruding outward of the hull.
- 18.3 Operable marine VHF radios shall be carried, which may be permanently installed or be waterproof handheld and **shall be turned on** whilst racing.
- 18.4 In addition to the Helmsperson, there **shall be at least one crew member who shall be competent to handle the boat in an emergency**.
- 18.5 All sailors competing **double-handed** shall wear a PFD Type 1, Level 100 or higher which conforms to AS 4758 or ISO 12402 or AS 1512.

19. SIGN ON [NP]

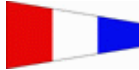

12.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races. **[DP]**
12.5 Boats that are **near the starting line in the last minute of another fleets start** may receive an **[SCP]** without a hearing.
12.6 A boat that does not start within five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (**DNS**) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.
12.7 **General Recall** - When a General Recall is signalled, the warning signal for a new start for the first recalled fleet will be made at the starting signal of the last fleet in the original sequence. New starts for other recalled fleets will follow in order thereafter. A General Recall signal will be displayed for 1 minute. This changes RRS 29.2 and race signal, 'First Substitute'. 

13. SHORTENING THE COURSE

13.1 **Before the start:** The RC may shorten a course before the starting signal by flying **Flag 'S'** over the fleet flag(s) no later than the warning signal. The marks prefixed * on the course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS32.

13.2 **After the start:**

a) The RC may shorten a course after the starting signal by flying **Flag 'S'** over the relevant fleet flag(s). The marks prefixed * on the Course sheets shall be omitted. This changes RRS32.

b) The RC may shorten the course in accordance with RRS32.2 - A RC vessel will fly **Flag 'S'**, the relevant fleet flag(s) and the **Blue Finish Line Flag**.

14. PENALTY SYSTEM





OFF THE BEACH SAILING INSTRUCTIONS




SOUTH of PERTH YACHT CLUB (Organising Authority (OA)) OFF THE BEACH SERIES 2024/2025 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in:
 - a) The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
 - b) The Prescriptions of Australian Sailing (AS) including the Special Regulations Part 2 for Off The Beach Boats.
 - c) The Class Rules where applicable.
 - d) The SoPYC Performance Handicapping Rules (PHS) where applicable.
 - e) Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 1.2 RRS44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

-  Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted not less than 2 hours before the scheduled warning signal on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.



3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Notice to Competitors (**NTC**) will be posted on the official notice board located in the foyer of the main clubhouse, plus the board at the Centreboard Clubhouse and online.
- 3.2 The race office is the On Water Group (**OWG**) located in the main clubhouse.
- 3.3 While racing, from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. **[DP]**

4. CODE OF CONDUCT **[DP]**

Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials and adhere to the AS Code of Conduct.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE


- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the signal mast on the Centreboard Clubhouse lawn.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in Race Signals AP. 
- 5.3 Bravo Course: When Flag 'D'  is flown from the Centreboard signal mast the following fleets will sail on Bravo Course: O'pen Skiff and Optimists.

6. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 The schedule of races, which includes the times of the first warning signals are published in the Red Book and online.
- 6.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least one minute before a warning signal is made.
- 6.3 No warning signal will be made after 1600.

7. CLASS FLAGS

7.1 The Class flags are:

7.2 Intermediate fleet sailors **shall fly a pink streamer** attached to the top of their mast.

8. RACING AREA

Racing will be conducted on Melville Water and Canning River.

9. COURSES AND MARKS

9.1 On each race day the courses to be sailed will be available from the Centreboard Clubhouse. The details will include:

- Diagrams to show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- The course to be sailed will be designated by an international numeral pennant corresponding to that course number, displayed below the relevant class flag.

9.2 When an orange **or** blue flag is displayed on the Race Committee (**RC**) vessel this will identify that the line is in use and a boat shall not pass in either direction through it except between its warning signal and starting, when finishing or when using the mark of the line as a rounding mark. **[NP][SCP]**

9.3 Bravo Course

- The nominated Bravo RC boat, shall be identified with Flag 'D'. 
- Bravo Fleets shall use **'Bravo Courses' sheets**.

10. THE START

10.1 Races will be started as detailed below. This changes RRS26.

Minutes before Starting Signal	Visual Signal	Sound Signal	Meaning
3	Class flag	One	Warning signal
2	Preparatory flag (P or U)	One	Preparatory signal
1	Preparatory flag removed	One long	One minute to start signal
0	Class flag removed	One	Starting signal


10.2 The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the RC boat at the starboard end and a black and white checkered inflatable buoy at the port end.

10.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races. **[SCP]**

10.4 A boat that does not start within 3 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (**DNS**) without a hearing. This changes RRSA5.

10.5 The RC will signal the order to start via class flags. Two classes may be started together.

10.6 The warning signal for the 2nd and 3rd races of the day, will not be made within the 3 minute window of the last boat finishing in the previous race.

10.7 **General Recall:** When a General Recall is signalled, the warning signal for a new start for the first recalled fleet will be made at the starting signal of the last fleet in the original sequence. New starts for other recalled fleets will follow in the order thereafter. A General Recall signal will be displayed for one minute. This changes RRS29.2 and race signal, 'First Substitute'. 

11. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE



- 11.1 To change the next leg of the course, the RC will move the original mark or the finishing line to a new position.
- 11.2 When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

12. THE FINISH

The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the RC boat and an inflatable buoy.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 13.1 RRS44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 13.2 Appendix T – Arbitration shall apply.
- 13.3 **[DP]** Discretionary Penalty – the penalty for a breach of this rule may at the discretion of the Protest Committee be less than disqualification.
- 13.4 **[NP]** Breaches of the SI's marked [NP] will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RR60.1(a).
- 13.5 **[SCP]** Scoring Penalty – for some specific breaches of the rules, the RC may apply a SCP without a hearing. The RC may still protest a boat when they consider the SCP inappropriate. The SCP is 2 points. This changes RRS63.1 & A5.

14. TIME LIMIT AND TARGET TIMES

- 14.1 Time limits shall apply to each class in accordance with the table below:

Flying 15, ILCA, Viper 640, Windsurfers

Event	Target Time	Time Limit for 1 st Boat	Finishing Window
Multiple Race Series	30-35 mins	60 mins	10 mins
Club Championship	45-50 mins	75 mins	15 mins

Club Championship	30 mins	40 mins	15 mins

- 14.2 If no boat sails the course and finishes within the Time Limit for the first boat, then the race will be abandoned.
- 14.3 The Finishing Window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window, and not subsequently retiring, penalized or given redress, will be scored Time Limit Expired (**TLE**) without a hearing. A boat scored TLE shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the points scored by the last boat that finished within the Finishing Window.
This changes RRS35, A5 & A10.
- 14.4 Failure to meet the Target Times will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS62.1(a).

15. PROTEST HEARING REQUESTS

- 15.1 The protest time limit is one hour after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the RC signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 15.2 Hearing request forms are available from OWG and online.

16. SCORING – refer NoR

17. SIGN ON [NP][SCP]

- 17.1 All boats shall complete a "Sign On/Off" as advised at registration.
- 17.2 "Sign/On" will be available **at least 1 hour before the first warning signal.**

- 17.3 Boats that fail to "Sign On/Off" shall receive a **[SCP]** without a hearing for each breach.
- 17.4 Boats coming to the starting area from another club, by water, shall complete "Sign On/Off" via the Start Boat prior to joining/leaving the course area.
- 17.5 Retirement from a race – A boat that retires shall notify a RC boat and complete the "Sign Off" immediately upon returning to shore.

18. CHANGE OF HELMSPERSON – Refer NoR

19. OUTSIDE HELP (On Water Coaching) [DP][NP]

- 19.1 Any class may request approval from the OA for a nominated club coach to conduct on-water coaching during any race except a Club Championship.
This changes RRS41(c).
- 19.2 O'pen Skiff, Optimist and the ILCA 4 sub-fleet may receive club approved on-water coaching for any race except Club Championship races

20 SUPPORT/COACH BOATS [DP][NP]

- 20.1 Support and coach boats shall register with OWG.
- 20.2 Support and coach boats shall remain at least **50 metres outside** areas where boats are racing from the time of the first preparatory signal until all boats have finished or the RC signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment, except when rendering assistance to a boat in distress.
- 20.3 All support and coach boats are required to have a VHF radio that is **turned on** and **monitoring VHF 69** or any other channel specified by the RC.
- 20.4 When requested by the Race Officer, support and coach boats shall render assistance as and when directed.
- 20.5 All support boats will have a minimum of **two able bodied persons** aboard.
- 20.6 All occupants of coach/support boats less than 6m LOA **shall wear an approved PFD** whilst afloat.
- 20.7 The skipper of a coach/support boat less than 6m LOA shall wear the engine kill switch cord.

SAFE BOATING POLICY

South of Perth Yacht Club encourages safe boating practices among its members. Boat owners are required at all times to comply with the regulations and conditions of the Department of Transport, as set out in the Marine Safety Rules and Regulations, together with any related statutory requirements.

All participants in racing competition conducted by the Race Committee of SoPYC are to comply with the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) as well as the AS Special Regulations set out in the 'Blue Book', together with the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions issued for each event.

The attention of sailors is drawn to this Safety Section segment of the 'Red Book' and to the requirement to complete an AS Equipment Audit Form when nominating for each sailing season.

All participants in racing and cruising events conducted by SoPYC are directed to Section 1, 1.01.1 of the AS Special Regulations:

“The purpose of these Special Regulations is to establish uniform minimum equipment, accommodation and training standards for racing boats and as a guide for cruising boats.”

and 1.02 1:

“The safety of a boat and her crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the person in charge who shall do their best to ensure that the boat is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by experienced crew who have undergone appropriate training and are physically fit to face bad weather. He must be satisfied as to the soundness of hull, spars, rigging, sails and all gear. He shall ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed and that the crew know where it is kept and how it is used. Attention is drawn to 2.04 that specifies the crew experience required for some races. He shall also nominate a person to take over the responsibilities of the person in charge in the event of his incapacitation.”

Special Regulations

BOAT EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

South of Perth Yacht Club's Emergency Response Plan (ERP) provides a systematic approach to responding to an incident occurring during an event conducted by the Club.

Emergency Response

SoPYC is not equipped to provide extensive emergency response.

WA Water Police (or AusSAR depending on the incident location) will coordinate emergency response for boats requiring external medical assistance when there is grave or imminent danger to the safety of boat or crew.

Pre-Event Preparation by the Skipper and Crew

- Ensure that all required safety equipment is on board and in good working condition.
- Have sufficient crew, appropriately experienced, able to cope with the conditions likely to be experienced.
- Brief the crew on emergency response in the case of an incident including locations of safety equipment, their emergency roles and procedures to be followed.
- Ensure the crew is familiar with the boat's Man Overboard (MOB) procedures. SoPYC recommends that the procedure is practiced before and during the sailing season.
- Have crew on board with a Senior First Aid Certificate (recommended for all events).
- Have crew on board with a Marine Radio Operators Certificate of Proficiency.
- Check event entry rules and be aware of any special safety requirements.

Notification of Incident

When a boat needs emergency assistance, it should use the standard marine emergency call procedures 000 or 112 – including PAN PAN or MAY DAY when required.

- **CONTACT CLUB** Use when assistance is required but an emergency has not yet arisen. Call the Emergency Response numbers.

- **PAN PAN** Use when an urgent safety message concerning safety of the boat or person is required but a MAY DAY call is not fully justified.
- **MAY DAY** Use only when a boat or person is in grave or imminent danger and requires immediate assistance.

SKIPPER'S ON-WATER EMERGENCY RESPONSE CHECKLIST

1. SoPYC Emergency Response Plan (ERP)

- a) Although SoPYC is not equipped to provide extensive emergency response, the South of Perth Yacht Club ERP provides a systematic approach to responding to an incident occurring during an event conducted by the Club.
- b) Do you have the SoPYC On Water Emergency Phone Numbers displayed on board?

2. Notification of Incident

- a) When a boat needs emergency assistance, it should use all available means to attract attention.
- b) Do you have flares, marine radio, mobile phone, or other communications on board?
- c) In the event a vessel is seriously damaged rendering it unsafe or unseaworthy and/or a person is seriously injured, have you notified the Department of Transport as required.
- d) Where a yacht requires emergency response, the yacht should use the standard marine emergency call procedures (MAY DAY or PAN PAN).
- e) MAY DAY – only used if a vessel or person is in grave or imminent danger and requires immediate assistance.
- f) PAN PAN – used when a MAY DAY distress call is not fully justified – urgent message concerning the safety of the vessel or person.
- g) If the incident does not warrant a MAY DAY or PAN PAN call, but assistance is required, contact SoPYC Race Control 0412 704 945 or on VHF 69.

3. Responsibility of the Skipper

- a) The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.
- b) Are you aware of the Australian Sailing Special Regulations 1.01 and 1.02.
- c) Have you complied with the Racing Rules of Sailing 1.2 – one PFD available for immediate use?
- d) Do you have the latest weather forecast and charts for the area?
- e) Is the vessel well found and adequate for the conditions?
- f) Are the crew appropriately experienced to cope with reasonably anticipated conditions?
- g) Do the event entry rules specify safety requirements?
- h) Is all safety equipment maintained, easily accessible at all times and conforms to appropriate Marine Standards?

4. Responsibility of the Crew

- (a) Each competitor is individually responsible for wearing a personal floatation device adequate for the conditions.
- (b) Are the crew members briefed on their individual role on the boat?
- (c) Are the crew familiar with the vessels Person-Overboard procedures?
- (d) Is there at least one other crew member, in addition to the Skipper, capable of handling the vessel in all conditions?

SKIPPER'S ON-WATER EMERGENCY RESPONSE CHECKLIST

5. Safety Briefing

- (a) A boat shall carry adequate life-saving equipment for all persons on board.
- (b) Has the Skipper provided a safety briefing; where it is stowed, how to use it and when to use it?
- (c) Does someone on board have a Senior First Aid Certificate?
- (d) Have the likely dangers of participating been discussed with the crew?
- (e) What equipment is available for use in the event of a collision between boats or a person-overboard?
- (f) Are all on board familiar with the use of flares, marine radio etc in the event the skipper or usual operator is incapable?

6. Intoxication

- (a) Skippers should ensure that the capabilities of all crew and passengers, as well as their own, are not adversely affected by the consumption of alcohol prior to or during any race or cruise. Aside from obvious dangers involved, the Water Police are paying increasing attention to the consumption of alcohol on private vessels and penalties can be severe.
- (b) Is there a policy on your vessel concerning if, when and how alcohol might be consumed?

7. Medical Emergency

- (a) For Hypothermia refer to the Advisory Appendix E of Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 1.
- (b) If urgent outside assistance is required, a vessel should:
 - i. Transmit a PAN PAN on VHF Ch. 16 or call Triple zero (000)
 - ii. Contact SoPYC Race Control 0412 704 945 or VHF 69
 - iii. What is the nature of the injury or complaint?
 - iv. Is an ambulance required, if so, at what location?

8. Person Overboard

- (a) Refer to the Advisory Appendix D of Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 1.
- (b) Have the crew carried out a person overboard exercise under all conditions of sailing?
- (c) If the vessel becomes disabled, is unable to retrieve the person overboard and/or loses sight of the person overboard, she should immediately issue an urgency call and make contact with SoPYC Race Control.

9. Heavy Weather Sailing

- (a) Refer to the Advisory Appendix F of Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 1.
- (b) Be aware of the heavy load a sea places on deck fittings.
- (c) Have you considered "heaving-to" (jib aback, main sheeted in tight and rudder steering to windward)?

10. Sea Sickness

- (a) Loss of fluids induces dehydration, encourage water intake in sips.
- (b) Secure and position person in lowest motion part of the vessel (usually the stern), face in the wind, with sight of horizon.
- (c) Avoid alcohol and greasy foods before voyage, consider heaving-to in serious cases.

11. Capsize and/or Sinking

- (a) Is anyone injured?

SKIPPERS ON-WATER EMERGENCY RESPONSE CHECKLIST

- (b) Use all available means to notify SoPYC Race Control, another vessel or other responsible persons of the situation.
- (c) Stay with the vessel (unless it sinks out of sight).
- (d) Right the vessel if possible.
- (e) Do everything possible to conserve core body heat.

12. Grounding

- (a) Assess damage and potential danger.
- (b) Unless taking on excessive water, make every effort to refloat the vessel before requesting outside assistance.
- (c) The decision to render assistance is at the discretion of those coming to your aid.

13. Collision resulting in Severe Damage

- (a) If the vessel is disabled she should immediately issue a PAN PAN call on VHF Ch. 16 or phone SoPYC Race Control.

14. Toxic Spills

- (a) Contact the Department of Transport Oil Pollution Reporting section listed in the Emergency Contacts.

15. Fire onboard

- (a) Most important consideration is human life, the boat is secondary.
- (b) Prevention is preferable to fire fighting.
- (c) Correct installation and good house-keeping, regular maintenance and fire prevention is necessary.
- (d) If possible, make a PAN PAN call.
- (e) Was the use and location of a fire blanket and/or extinguisher covered in the safety equipment briefing?

SEQUENCE FOR A COMPLETE DISTRSS CALL AND MESSAGE

Press the VHF DSC (Digital Selective Calling) Distress Alert button, if fitted, followed by:

- Distress signal (x3) **MAYDAY, MAYDAY, MAYDAY**
- Words 'this is' THIS IS
- Station calling (x3) (Vessel's name – three times)

DISTRESS MESSAGE

- Distress signal **MAYDAY**
- Name/MMSI* [Vessel's name]
- Position
- Nature of the distress
- Persons on board (POB)
- Other Information (If time permist)

MAN OVERBOARD PROCEDURE

Extract taken from the Australian Sailing Special Regulations
- Section 8 - Advisory Appendices - Advisory Appendix D to Part 1

MAN OVERBOARD - QUICK STOP AND THE LIFE SLING (OR SEATTLE SLING)

When a crew member goes over the side recovery time is of the essence. The hallmark of this method is the immediate reduction of boat speed by turning to windward and then manoeuvring slowly, remaining near the victim. In most cases, this is better than reaching off, then gybing or tacking and returning on a reciprocal course.

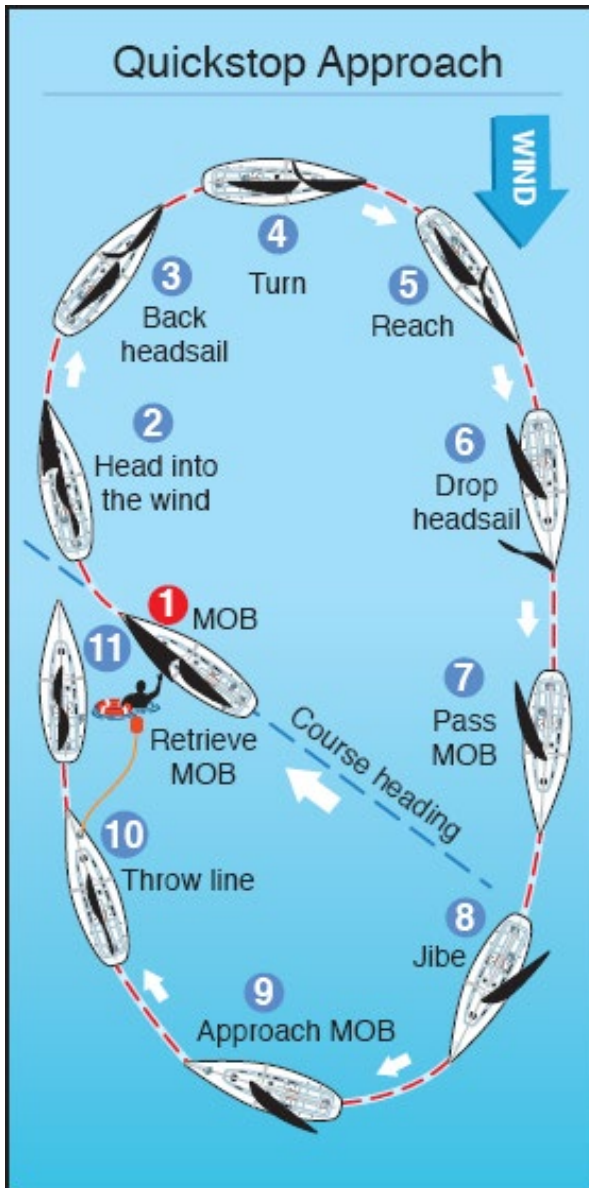
QUICK STOP METHOD

1. Shout 'man overboard' and detail a crew member to spot and point to the victim's position in the water. The spotter should not take his eyes off the victim (see Figure 1).
2. Provide immediate flotation. Throw buoyant objects such as cockpit cushions, life rings and so on. These objects may not only come to the aid of the victim, but will litter the water where he went overboard and help your spotter to keep him in view. Deployment of the pole and flag (dan buoy) requires too much time. The pole is saved to put on top of the victim in case the initial manoeuvre is unsuccessful.
3. Bring boat head-to-wind and beyond (see Figure 1)
4. Allow headsail to back and further slow the boat.
5. Keep turning with headsail backed until wind is abaft the beam.
6. Head on beam-to-broad reach course for two or three lengths then go nearly dead downwind.
7. Drop the headsail while keeping the mainsail centred (or nearly so). The jib sheets are not slacked, even during the dousing manoeuvre, to keep them inside the lifelines.
8. Hold the downward course until victim is abaft the beam.
9. Gybe.
10. Approach the victim on a course of approximately 45 degrees to 60 degrees off the wind.
11. Establish contact with the victim with heaving line or other device. The Naval Academy uses a "throwing sock" containing 25 metres of light floating line and a bag that can be thrown into the wind because the line is kept inside the bag and trails out as it sails to the victim.
12. Effect recovery over the windward side.

Quick Stop Under Spinnaker

The same procedure is used to accommodate a spinnaker. Follow the preceding instructions. As the boat comes head-to-wind and the pole is eased to the head stay, the spinnaker halyard is lowered and the sail is gathered on the fore deck. The turn is continued through the tack and the approach phase commences
