


Junior Learn to Sail Program

The Learn to Sail program at South of Perth Sailing Club focuses on creating opportunities to encourage active learning for young sailors and develop broad skills and confidence. We use a Structured Learning Methodology (SLM) which keeps sailors engaged and wanting to learn and progress their skills.

Typically sailors start at 8 years old. Some may start earlier and some later but we try to have sailors go through the program with similar age groups as the friendships and comradery is a major key to their long term enjoyment.

The Learn to Sail program starts with a TrySail course, which allows sailors and families to see if sailing is a good fit for everyone. If it goes well and the coaches, sailors, and family would like to go further we invite sailors to the Learn to Sail step (Green Fleet). After Green Fleet, we allow time for sailors to Transition into fun racing skills to prepare them for racing if they choose. Normally sailors believe in their newfound competence and want more.



Coaching

Time on the water and practice is how our young sailors improve & build confidence

Weekly training: Tuesdays 4 - 6.30 pm (summer) & 4 - 6 pm (winter) Sundays 9.30 - 12 pm

Boats rigged up and sailors ready to sail by 4:15 pm. A briefing by the coach is conducted before heading out on the water by 4:30 pm

A dedicated coach and support boats will be 'on the water' for all OTB races

The coach will deliver a pre-race and post-race briefing to all sailors

During most regattas, SoPYC will provide a coach for 'on the water' support.

- Inspect dinghy before purchase
- The sail number will provide a guide on age of dinghy e.g. Optimist AUS1557 built in 2002
- Purchase must include Registration & Measurement Book
- Check ISAF plaque in dinghy matches the number recorded in the measurement book
- It is the buyer's responsibility to register the transfer of ownership with AIODA
- Optional accessories that may be included with purchase boat cover, sail bag, spare sail, equipment spares
